The Much-Anticipated Metro Regional Connector Is Now Open

With the opening of the Regional Connector, the A, E and L Lines have been combined into two, which are now the A and E Lines.

Metro Joins Omnitrans in Offering "Fare Capping" on Rides

As of July 1, Metro switched to "fare capping"—a new way to pay fares that makes it easier and more affordable to ride bus and rail.

Omnitrans transit in San Bernardino adopted this fare system in summer of 2022.

With fare capping, the more you ride, the more you save. Rides are free once you meet the daily or weekly fare cap—even when paying per-ride.

That means now when riding Metro, you'll never pay more than \$5 in a day

or \$18 within seven days. This is less than the regular price of Metro's regular 1-Day and 7-Day passes, which are being replaced with fare capping.

You must pay using a **TAP card.** For more information:
